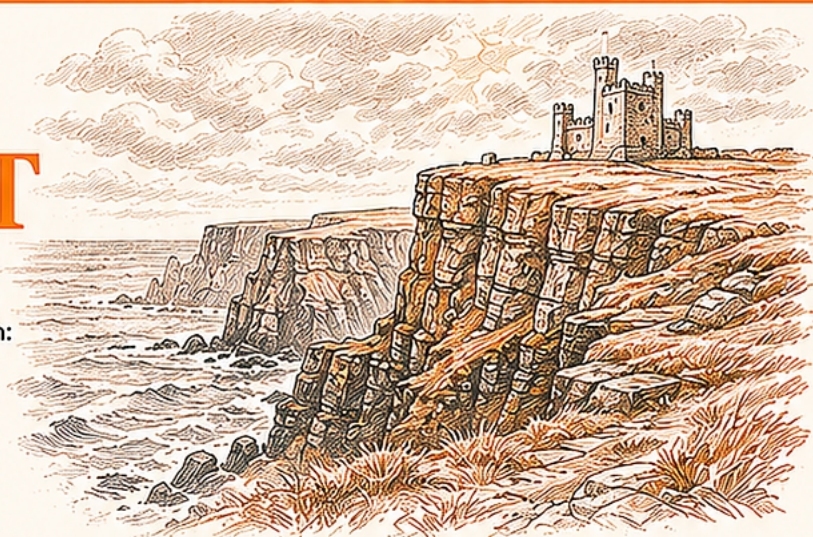


Packing for Ireland means accepting one simple truth:

CLOTHING & FOOTWEAR



LAYERS ARE KEY

- ☐ Moisture-wicking T-shirts (2–4)
- ☐ Long-sleeve shirts
- ☐ Sweater or wool jumper
- ☐ Warm fleece or lightweight down jacket
- ☐ Lightweight hoodie



OUTERWEAR

- ☐ Lightweight rain jacket (waterproof)
- ☐ Waterproof rain pants
- ☐ Umbrella (compact, optional)



BOTTOMS

- ☐ Hiking pants
- ☐ Comfortable travel pants or jeans
- ☐ Shorts (summer)



FOOTWEAR

- ☐ Waterproof walking shoes or hiking boots
- ☐ Comfortable casual shoes
- ☐ Wool or moisture-wicking socks (3–5 pairs)



ACCESSORIES

- ☐ Warm hat (beanie)
- ☐ Scarf or neck gaiter
- ☐ Light gloves
- ☐ Sunglasses
- ☐ Sun hat or cap

- ☐ Small daypack (15–25L)
- ☐ Reusable water bottle
- ☐ Snacks & packed lunch
- ☐ Trekking poles (optional)
- ☐ Offline maps downloaded to your phone
- ☐ Sunscreen
- ☐ Lip balm
- ☐ Small first aid kit
- ☐ Blister treatment (moleskin or blister pads)
- ☐ Hand sanitizer
- ☐ Insect repellent (summer)



EXTRAS THAT HELP



- ☐ Travel towel
- ☐ Dry bag or ziplock bags for electronics
- ☐ Binoculars (optional)
- ☐ Travel journal or book

- ☐ Travel insurance information
- ☐ Hotel & itinerary confirmations
- ☐ Credit & debit cards
- ☐ Small amount of local currency
- ☐ Copies of important documents



TOILETRIES & HEALTH

- ☐ Toothbrush & toothpaste
- ☐ Prescription medications
- ☐ Travel-size toiletries
- ☐ Hand sanitizer
- ☐ Tissues
- ☐ Any personal essentials

- ☐ Notify your bank of international travel
- ☐ Download offline maps & translation apps



- ☐ Reserve popular attractions in advance

SEASONAL ADDITIONS



SPRING (MAR–MAY)

Warm fleece, waterproof pants, gloves



WINTER (DEC–FEB)

Insulated jacket, thermal layers, warm hat, waterproof gloves, thick wool socks
