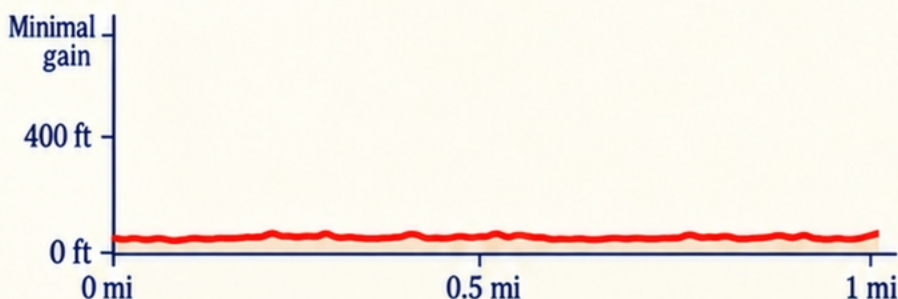

TRAILHEAD:
70543 NE Hatchery Way,
Cascade Locks



ACCESSIBILITY:
Paved, mostly level routes.
ADA restrooms and viewing center.



FACILITIES:
Restrooms, picnic tables,
exhibits, and gift shop.



WATER:
Drinking fountains near
visitor buildings.



CELL SERVICE:
Generally reliable.



HOURS:
Daily, 7:30 a.m. to dusk.
Indoor hours may vary.



PARKING:
Free, large paved lot.
Take I-84 Exit 40.



DOGS:
Leashed outdoors. Keep away
from ponds and work areas.



COST:
Free. Bring quarters
for trout food.



WHAT TO BRING:
Comfortable shoes, water,
camera, sun and light layer.
